FROM THE PASTOR

A Gem among the Sweeping Richness

Toward the end of our time serving in Germany, Michael went through one of his most frightening experiences: "The Parish Visitation". It simply was the turn of the fourpoint parish he served to host the event. This "Visitation" set the teeth of pastors on edge as the Dean (with significantly more power than in this country) and all ordained clergy of the synodical conference descended upon the parish and the resident clergy had to lead a worship service, preach, teach a Confirmation class, show the visitors the particularities of the locale and engage in a lengthy discussion and examination regarding the past, present and future ministry of the parish. This was a

two-day deal and pretty much had the entire congregation up in arms – perhaps none more than the Women's group who felt that their cooking and baking reputation was at stake! I was tasked with having all four churches and the

Parish Fellowship Hall sparkling clean. For the record: The Visitation turned out wonderful!

Well, the nervous pastors had to thank nobody but Martin Luther himself for this stressful undertaking. It all began in 1526, less than a decade after the initial Reformation events, that committees visited congregations to survey the prevailing conditions of parish life. And the result was not pretty, to say the least. The congregations had been neglected for many years and the turmoil of the Reformation had brought with it additional difficulties and disruptions. There were problems aplenty with pressure to remedy such. Nobody was more upset than Dr. Luther himself and the result of these visitations are what we now know as the Small (1528) and Large Catechism (1529).

To understand Luther's level of disgust with what he found in the parishes, one must read the introduction to his work; here it is:

The deplorable, miserable conditions which I recently observed when visiting the parishes have constrained and pressed me to put this

catechism of Christian doctrine into this brief, plain, and simple form.
How pitiable, so help me God, were the things I saw:

the common man, especially in the villages, knows practically nothing of Christian doctrine, and many of the pastors are almost entirely incompetent and unable to teach. Yet all the people are supposed to be Christians, have been baptized, and receive the Holy Sacrament even though they do not know the Lord's Prayer, the

sincerely to the duties of your office, that you feel

in the people, especially the young.

Creed, or the Ten Commandments and live like poor animals of the barnyard and pigpen. What these people have mastered, however, is the fine art of tearing all Christian liberty to shreds.

Oh, you bishops! How will you ever answer to Christ for letting the people carry on so disgracefully and not attending to the duties of your office even for a moment? One can only hope judgment does not strike you! You command the Sacrament in one kind only, insist on the observance of your human ways, and yet are unconcerned whether the people know the

Lord's Prayer, the Creed, the Ten Commandments, or indeed any of God's Word. Woe, woe to you forever!

Therefore, dear brothers, for God's sake I beg all of you who are pastors and preachers to devote yourselves sincerely to the duties of your office, that you feel compassion for the people entrusted to your care, and that you help us accordingly to inculcate this catechism in the people, especially the young. If you cannot do more, at least take the tables and charts for catechism instruction and drill the people in them word for word...

While the Large Catechism is a significantly more extensive writing and meant primarily for clergy, the Small Catechism is a collection of questions and answers on six topics: the Ten Commandments, the Apostles' Creed, the Lord's Prayer, the Sacraments of Holy Baptism and Holy Communion and the Office of the Keys (Absolution and Forgiveness). It was originally meant to be used by the head of the household to teach the family the Christian faith. Which, immediately, of course, begs the question: how did that work out for Luther?!

It is no secret that this task Luther envisioned for individual families, has long falling into the lap of the church. Some of you may remember learning the Catechism word for word by heart (as did I) and are fond of its message having penetrated and guided your life. Others will remember it with horror and perhaps with a sheepish smile recall how you

played more tricks on your Pastor than attended to the words of wisdom in your Catechism...

The shape of the Catechism is the shape of the Christian life: Repentance (Ten Commandments), Faith (Creed), Prayer (Lord's Prayer), Forgiveness of Sins (Baptism, Absolution, Lord's Supper).


The Catechism helps us understand God's Law, which shows us our sin, and how we are to live as His people. It also beautifully articulates the Gospel, the Good News of Jesus'

life, death and resurrection for our salvation. Luther realized that the truth of God's Word, summarized by the Catechism, were matters of eternal life and death. It is unfortunate when people think they no longer need them/it.

When I first started in ministry in 1988, I insisted that my students learned the Catechism (with explanations) by heart. Since then, I have 'strayed' and only attempt to the best of my ability to instruct kids on the spirit of the individual

sections. I know that memorization becomes more and more difficult. And yet, we are still able to do it! I am amazed at how many pop songs my granddaughter can sing from memory! Is it because she hears and plays them over and over again? When was the last time we read thru the Catechism over and over again? It is profoundly true: we need to learn to speak the language of our faith before we can understand it. If my experience with my granddaughter applies more broadly, our children should be able to know the explanation to the third article of the Creed as well as the latest song by Taylor Swift. But you know I am a realist! ©

Aside from all pros and cons of learning the document by heart and applying it to our faith life, it is a gem in the midst of the many writings Luther left for us. While his sermons were often very lengthy and his essays not always easy to digest and while he was a man



of his time with ideas often strange to us, Luther did us a tremendous favor with the Small Catechism. With few and simple words, Luther shows us the basics of our faith. Nobody needs a Ph.D. in Theology to understand "we are to fear, love and trust God above anything else". Now, we might not be able to follow suit, but we know what it means!

I encourage you to use this year of Reformation celebration as a stepping stone to familiarize yourself – and your family! – once more (or for the first time) with the plain words of Luther as he attempts to show us the minimum parameters of our faith. It is always worth your time. As Luther asks over and over again in the Catechism: what does that mean? Well. let's find out......

Francis focused his attention on the country's tiny Catholic population. But the specter of brutal attacks against the Catholic and Coptic believers who total just 10 percent of Egypt's 92-million strong population loomed as the pontiff reiterated the message.


...that in a country where 82 percent are **Christian**, halal, the dietary standard in Islamic law, is finding greater acceptance? **Kenya** is now home to a modest 100 halal-compliant food industry businesses, offering Muslims a choice of offerings and convenience, but that market may be growing. In addition to the country's estimated 4 million Muslims (out of 42 million), halal is finding favor among Christians as well. Halal, which means "lawful" or "permitted" in Arabic, requires that meat such as beef, lamb, goat and poultry be raised and killed humanely and that a blessing be said at the time of slaughter. Non-halal foods include carnivorous animals and birds of prey, as well as pork and products derived from pork such as gelatin. Fish, vegetables, fruits, nuts and grains are permitted.


The Women of Emmanuel are planning an outing to the Galleria de Paco in Waterloo on Thursday, June 29th.
