Find out how Anneliese even has a connection to the Grafton area!


All members of Emmanuel and the wider community are most welcome to attend this event! Coffee and Pastries will sweeten our time together.

Anneliese Tisdale was born in Germany. In 1947, she came to the United States as a war bride and became a U.S. citizen in 1950. She received BA and MA degrees from the University of Iowa. After her retirement from the Cedar Rapids public schools, and at the urging of her children, she wrote her first book, *Christmas Trees Lit the Sky*, her memoir about growing up in World War II Germany. The book vividly describes her family's struggle to survive the war, as well as the Nazi regime, during some of the most defining times of the twentieth century.

Anneliese has presented numerous readings, discussions and book signings in libraries, schools, and clubs in Iowa, Missouri and Ohio. She was invited to give the 2014 Memorial Lecture for the Wartburg College History Honor Society. Anneliese was pleased to do a book signing with Markus Zusak, author of *The Book Thief*, in connection with the Linn Area Reads Book of the Year. She is currently writing about her life as a newcomer to the United States.
