#### **LEAN ON GOD**



"As the Father has loved me, so I have I loved you. Abide in my love." John 15:9

We have heard and read the word "abide" countless times over the years. It is in the Bible, in hymns and in prayers. I read an article in which the author told of his seminary professor's lesson

on the Greek word for "abide". He said that the word literally means "lean back or put your full weight on an object." The example he used was lying on a bed or sitting in a chair. 

While the Annual Meeting gives us the opportunity to reflect and evaluate what happened last year at Emmanuel, it also surely is a chance for all voting members of Emmanuel to set the course of our ministry for the coming twelve months. Don't leave that decision to your neighbors!

...that Christmas is not over yet? There are 12 days to the Christmas celebration and here are a few of the people and events who significantly influence the Body of Christ: December 26 – St. Stephen is honored as the first Christian martyr; December 27 – St. John is remembered not only as a writer of his Gospel and letters but as the one who stood at the cross and took responsibility for Mother Mary; December 28 – The Martyrdom of the Holy Innocents recalls the brutal murder of small children by King Herod in his effort to squelch the importance of Jesus whom he saw as a danger to his throne; December 29 – King David- the ancestor of the Baby Jesus was blessed to lead Israel to its greatest height. David was a sinner for whom Jesus was born and died; January 1 – the circumcision and naming of the Christ-child; Jesus now 'officially' receives the name the angel told: "the one who will save his people from their sins"; and finally, January 5 – the last day of the Christmas tide and the day that leads into the beginning of the Epiphany season.

...that lamenting "the winds of war" blowing around the world, Pope Francis in his traditional Christmas message called for a two-state solution to find peace in the Middle East and prayed that confrontation can be overcome on the Korean Peninsula. The pope took particular aim at areas of global tension where President

Trump is playing a critical role..."The winds of war are blowing in our world and an outdated model of development continues to produce human, societal and environmental decline," the pope said on Christmas Day in his traditional "Urbi et Orbi" ("to the city and to the world") Christmas message and blessing from the central balcony overlooking St. Peter's Square. As Christians celebrate the birth of Jesus, the pope depicted suffering reflected "in the faces of little children," citing war and other tensions in the Middle East and Africa. He asked for peace for Jerusalem and the Holy Land and prayed "that the will to resume dialogue may prevail between the parties and that a negotiated solution can finally be reached, one that would allow the peaceful coexistence of two states within mutually agreed and internationally recognized borders."

...that Reading the Word of God, a daily Bible reading guide, has been prepared for Lutherans to use over the next three years? The guide was conceived and prepared as a result of ongoing discussions between representatives of the NALC, the Lutheran Church—Canada (LCC), and the Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod (LCMS). The guide includes monthly calendars with daily readings starting in January 2018. As a companion to the daily Bible reading guide,

52 suggested readings are offered from the book, "Luther and the Scriptures" by Johann Michael Reu (1869–1943), a German-born American Lutheran theologian who taught at Wartburg Theological Seminary in Dubuque, lowa, from 1899 until his death. Reading the Word of God — the daily Bible reading guide and the monthly calendars — are available online at www.thenalc.org.

Although you will be able to see and study the following numbers in your Annual Report booklet, in case you don't, here is some information regarding our Benevolence giving for the year 2017. How did we do? Well, of course, it would be too flippant not to suggest that there is room for improvement. There is – lots of it.

On the other hand, we could have done much worse and we can be glad that we will be able to bless various agencies and para-church organizations with our benevolent financial gifts. For those we say a collective 'THANK YOU' to all who contributed through marking their weekly envelop accordingly. I think it helps to point out once in a while that our general budget (Current Fund) does not provide for these gifts to places outside our community. 
