Tough-Minded or Tender-Hearted, that is the Question

While I am writing this, our three youngest grandchildren are "horsing around" in the parsonage yard. At the ages of eight, eleven and thirteen (and deeply bonded since they were toddlers), most of the time they get along splendidly. As a matter of fact, I think they all would abandon their best friends in a

heartbeat just to be with each other.

But, there are plenty of moments that rub on our grand-parental nerves when they fight, whine, scream and say nasty things to each other.

Therefore, we have had 'lessons' on repentance, forgiveness and the

love of a family this summer © To be sure: our four grandkids are delightful; we love them more than life itself and are proud of all their accomplishments. What a gift we have in and through them all. Yet, we try to be realistic in recognizing the struggles that they will bring to others and the struggles that others

will bring into their precious lives.

Spending time with our grandkids between moments of belly laughs and stern words of warning, I am reminded of a story I read about a little Preschool girl named Emily. Emily's parents were told by her teacher that the little girl was an absolute angel – but:

> if she would not learn how to toughen up, she would be eaten alive in her Chicago public school setting. The advice the teacher gave to the parents was clear as well: teach her to hit back when they hit her.

Now, bullying starts indeed in Preschool and recipes as

to how to address it are

various, all the way from 'ignore' to 'beat the living daylights out of them'.

Emily sounds like a girl who will brake for butterflies when she gets her driver's permit. Perhaps she will grow up to be a security officer like the woman in Viera, Florida who lost her job because

she was "too courteous, caring and giving" for her courthouse security assignment.



Now, I am not advocating for our children to become door mats for their peers. There comes a time when enough is enough and some harsh actions need to take place so our society can remain a place that provides at least a minimum of safety for all. We surely want children like Emily to hang on to their caring personalities and not encourage them to forsake the very quality on which a thoughtful society depends.



When Jesus sent out his disciples as 'sheep in the midst of wolves', he attached some additional words to live by: 'be wise as serpents and innocent as doves'. It was Martin Luther King, Jr. who

suggested that those who want to lead good lives must simultaneously blend 'markedly strong opposites' within themselves. "We must combine the toughness of the serpent with the softness of the dove", Dr. King said. Soft-minded people fear change and hard-hearted people never really learn to love; King insisted.

For us Lutherans that sort of makes a connection to the distinction of Law and Gospel. The Law

convicts us and the Gospel saves us with grace and mercy. We need both. The kid who bullies needs to be stopped. The spouse who is abusive must live with the consequences of the actions perpetrated. The employee who misuses the goodness of co-workers and supervisors needs to be held accountable. And so on and so on....such is the Law, the Kingdom of the Left, as we say. But we need the little (and big!) Emilys of this world as well. We need those who brake for butterflies and do not think twice about turning the other cheek. And, we need to exercise, expect and accept both of those qualities within ourselves and others. Dr. King said that "God is neither hard-hearted nor soft-minded. God is tough-mined enough to transcend the world, and tender-hearted enough to live in it."

We must combine the toughness of the serpent with the softness of the dove, a tough mind and a tender heart.

Learning to cultivate such strong opposites might just be what will allow a beautiful little Emily to hold onto her caring self in a rough and tumble world. Reminding ourselves of such opposites will hopefully help all of us to know that our human condition calls for some tricky maneuvering so we do not confuse being touch-minded with being cold-hearted or abdicate one or the other altogether. Our relationships with one another will surely depend on it. And: as we begin a new school year of learning and teaching, let us commit ourselves to making sure all the little Emily's around us can learn by observing us....


Janice Wahl Rumbley, who passed away in November 2017, was inurned on Saturday, June 15th at 1pm in the Grafton cemetery.
