There are things that they need some help with so they will be able to stay in their home at 3496 Zinnia Ave, Plymouth.

### **Items that need attention are:**

1. LARGE TREE BRANCH TO BE CUT UP THAT FELL BEHIND THE HOUSE
2. TRIM TREE LIMBS THAT ARE RUBBING ON THE HOUSE
3. WEED EAT AROUND THE FOUNDATION OF THE HOUSE
4. INSTALL SCREEN DOORS THAT THEY HAD PURCHASED
5. SEE WHY THE ELECTRICAL OUTLETS DO NOT WORK UPSTAIRS AFTER A RECENT STORM
6. SEE WHY THE TWO FLOURESCENT LIGHTS DOWN STAIRS DO NOT WORK (BALLASTS?)
7. SEE WHY THE BASEMENT CONTINUES TO GET WATER, COULD POSSIBLY USE FILL AROUND THE ENTIRE HOME TO BUILD UP FOR THE WATER TO DRAIN AWAY
8. SEE WHY TOILET UPSTAIRS DOES NOT WORK
9. SEE WHY HOUSE ROOF LEAKS AROUND WHERE CHIMNEY WAS TAKEN DOWN
10. HOOK UP WATER HYDRANT IN MILK HOUSE FOR EMERGENCY
11. FIX CELLAR DOOR

12. FIX GARAGE DOOR

13. FIX CORN CRIB DOORS TO SHUT

14. INSTALL TIN ON CORN CRIB, MATERIAL IS THERE
