Instructions for Holy Communion...As we serve Holy Communion today, we will do so with each household being ushered up separately and the next household (individual, couple or family) waiting in the pew until the previous one has left the chancel area. Pastor will sanitize her hands between each group and will be the only person who prepares, serves and cleans up the vessels and the elements. After the consecration at the altar, Pastor will move to the middle of the nave where you will see three tables. The middle one will have a large plate with the bread/host. The side tables will have trays with wine. Pastor Z then will give you a wafer. Then you will be asked to take a cup of wine from the tray. As you return to your seat, place your empty glass on a plate that is in front of the first pew on both sides of the aisle.
