P: The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God and the Communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all. **C: And also with you**

Hymn: **How Long, O God**

1. "How long, O God?" the psalmist cries, a cry we make our own, for we are lost, alone, afraid, and far away from home.
2. The evil lurks within, without, it threatens to destroy the fragile cords that make us one, that bind our hearts in joy.
3. Your grace, O God, seems far away; will healing ever come? Our broken lives lie broken still; will night give way to dawn?
4. How can we hope? How can we sing? O God, set free our voice to name the sorrows, name the pain, that we might yet rejoice.

The Instruction

P: In this Lenten season... and each other.

The Confession

P: Father of mercies and God of all consolation, come to the aid of your people, turning us from our sin to live for you alone. Give us the power of your Holy Spirit that we may attend to your Word, confess our sins, receive your forgiveness, and grow into the

fullness of your Son Jesus Christ, our Lord and our Redeemer. **C: Amen**

C: Almighty God, merciful Father: I, a troubled and penitent sinner, confess to you all my sins and iniquities with which I have offended you and for which I justly deserve your punishment. But I am sorry for them, and repent of them, and pray for your boundless mercy. For the sake of the suffering and death of your Son, Jesus Christ, be gracious and merciful to me, a poor sinful being; forgive my sins, give me your Holy Spirit for the amendment of my sinful life, and bring me to life everlasting. Amen

P: Almighty God in his mercy has given his Son to die for us and, for his sake, forgives us all our sins. Through his Holy Spirit he cleanses us and gives us power to proclaim the mighty deeds of God who called us out of darkness into the splendor of his light. As a called and ordained minister of the Church of Christ and by his authority, I therefore declare to you the entire forgiveness of all your sins, in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Sermon

The Nicene Creed

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came
