# FROM THE CALL COMMITTEE Update on the Call Process

On June 27<sup>th</sup>, we had our congregational meeting during which the congregation was able to give input about what we are looking for in our new pastor and the direction of the future of Emmanuel. Using the ideas shared at the meeting, the Call Committee met on July 8th and completed the Congregational Profile. The congregational profile video was also completed and both were submitted to the NALC. We are now at the **wait and pray** part of the process. Our information is available to any pastor seeking a call through the NALC website and is sent out to all pastors in the NALC monthly by Pastor Wendel. When a pastor is interested in our church, the call committee will review their information and conduct an interview. After a candidate is found that the call committee thinks might be a good fit, we will likely host the pastor for a weekend visit, where they will get to meet with the call committee and council in person, as well as conduct service for the whole congregation and meet everyone at fellowship hour. After the weekend visit, if the call committee decides to move forward, we would hold a vote with all members of the congregation. As we wait for potential pastors, please keep in mind that this process can take time and the best thing we can do is pray for God's guidance toward the right pastor for Emmanuel. *Submitted by CC Secretary, Brittany Bartz* 

A word to the Congregation: (Taken from the NALC *Call Process manual*): "...the call process is a spiritual process of discernment led by the Holy Spirit. It is God's process, not the congregation's. It will take whatever time God intends, so there will be no rushing to judgment...Calling a pastor is not the equivalent of "hiring an employee." It is much more relational and covenantal. Calling a pastor is much more like a marriage, and the call process more similar to finding a mate for life...Ask that all members be in regular prayer for the call committee and congregational leadership. Ask all to pray that God will be working in the heart and life of the pastor He wishes to call as your next pastor, that the pastor be open to the working of the Holy Spirit. Praver will be as essential a part of your call process as everything the call committee does! ... the call process is about "Waiting for the Lord." "In Psalm 27, the psalmist writes, 'Wait for

the LORD; be strong, and let your heart take courage; wait for the LORD!"


#### **Connection Groups:**

After Labor Day, Emmanuel Lutheran will start holding connection groups throughout the year. Many of you may ask what exactly is a connection group, and why should you be a part of it? Well, a connection group is an informal bible study that takes place in a group member's home that serves two purposes. The first is to make connections with other members of our congregation. There are many of us who may know each other's names, but in reality, know very little about each other. These groups will allow us to get to know each other on a deeper level to help truly create a community of believers here at Emmanuel. The goal is to make groups that connect us outside of our normal family and age groups.

The second purpose of a connection group is to help all of us grow in our faith and create a deeper understanding of God's word through this fellowship and study. The more people we have join connection groups the stronger our bonds as a congregation and community of believers will become. Especially as we are in a time without a Pastor to shepherd us, we will need to help one another in our faith journeys.

### **STEWARDSHIP MUSINGS**

As many of you know, summer is a busy time of year, especially when it is followed by a year of the unknown, being challenged by COVID19 in a way that affected each and every one of us in new and different circumstances. For most of us, it affected our travels, shopping, every day living, church attendance. And when we did venture out, it meant wearing a mask, sanitizing our hands, standing six feet apart, always being vigilant. Even a trip to the grocery store or for a few items at a discount store turned into a longer process than we may have liked. Going out to eat meant waiting in long drive-through lines. Or going out at all meant weighing the pros and cons... Fast forward to summer 2021. People are able to gather together. Traveling is once again a "normal" activity. And, as happens, church attendance drops. In the July 2021 NALC News, Rev. Dr. David Wendel has written an article titled, "One More!" In it he talks about church attendance and some interesting facts he learned. The following is from that article:

"According to Sam Rainer, founder and CEO of Church Answers, in 2018, the median size of all congregations in the United States was 75 people, while most congregations are less than 100 average worshiping attendance. At the same time, the median age of church members was 73 years old.

He points out in a separate research study that much of the attendance decline is the result of a drop in frequency of worship attendance. A congregation may have the same number of participants, but they are worshiping less frequently, which lowers the average worship attendance. Rainer writes: Stated simply, the number one reason for the decline in church attendance is that members attend with less frequency than they did just a few years ago. Allow me to explain. When membership becomes truly meaningful, our churches will become an unstoppable force for the Kingdom and glory of God. If the frequency of attendance changes, then attendance will respond accordingly. For example, if 200 members attend every week the average attendance is, obviously, 200. But if one-half of those members miss only one out of four weeks, the attendance drops to 175.

Did you catch that? No members left the church. Everyone is still relatively active in the church. But attendance declined over 12 percent because half the members changed their attendance behavior slightly. This phenomenon can take place rather quickly in an individual church. And leaders in the church are often left scratching their heads because the behavioral change is so slight, almost imperceptible. We really don't notice when someone who attends four times a month begins to attend only three times a month. Nor do we typically catch it when the twice-a-month attendee becomes a once-a-month attendee. This is an insight that most of us have missed.

We see worship attendance decline over time and assume it is loss of members. Sure, some congregations are losing members, but Rainer's research indicates that 'the number one reason for the decline in church attendance is that members attend with less frequency than they did just a few years ago.'

The good news in this statistic is that to reverse the trend and perhaps increase worship attendance, we need no exciting, high-powered evangelism strategy, no marketing campaign and no influx of new members. Indeed, to increase congregational worship attendance, it takes only members making a commitment to attend worship one more Sunday than usual! (*emphasis mine*) ... And what impact does increasing worship attendance make in a congregation? Why will it matter?

1. Increasing, rather than declining, worship attendance generates excitement, a positive attitude and hope for the future.

2. Increasing worship attendance uplifts and encourages pastors and will, over time, improve preaching.

3. While we may wish it were not the case, many members still give financially only when they attend worship. <u>Increasing worship attendance always increases giving. (emphasis mine)</u>

4. Weekly worship attendance, like so many aspects of faith, is a helpful spiritual habit. The more regular we are in worship, the more we develop the habit of weekly worship...

Setting such a goal may be especially helpful as many have gotten out of the habit of regular, in-person worship during the pandemic. Sam Rainer estimates worship attendance post-COVID-19 will be 20 percent lower than before the pandemic. Getting back to worship will take intentionality on the part of all of us. And it will benefit you, your pastor and your congregation!" (To read the rest of the article, visit thenalc.org and look up the July newsletter.)

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#### Call Committee/Council Meeting with Dean Staley May 17, 2021

Pastor Christopher Staley, Dean of the Iowa Mission District of the NALC, called the meeting to order at 7:05 p.m. In attendance for the Council was Marena Henkle, Emi Kuntz, JC Dawald, Mark Fredrickson, Belinda Borchardt, Will Bartz, Abbie Steinberg and Sharon Hulshizer. Absent: Michael Cole. Those in attendance for the Call Committee were Darren Marsh, Mary Jo Urbatsch, Phil Hackbart, Dan Nack, Emi Kuntz, and Brittany Bartz.

Dean Staley talked about the Call process, recommending that the Call Committee read through the NALC Call Process Manual. There was discussion regarding finding someone to cover Emmanuel's Pastoral needs after Pastor Z is gone. The Church Council is to find someone to cover this, possibly using a pastor for emergencies and lay persons to do home visits.

The first step in the Call process will be that of setting up a conference call between the Call Committee and Pastor David Wendel, assistant to the Bishop of Ministry and Ecumenism for the NALC. This will place via Zoom as Pastor Wendel is located in Florida. Eventually, a Congregational profile will be submitted to Pastor Wendel and he will send out the information to potential candidates for ministry.

After the conference call, there will be a Congregational Workshop at Emmanuel with Dean Staley. This will be a Bible study and brainstorming session to discuss the history of the church, future desires, priorities, worship styles, etc. It was suggested to have it on a Sunday and serve a lunch so that as many congregation members as possible can attend. The larger number of people, the better. A potential date of June 27<sup>th</sup>, following Worship, was discussed for this workshop. Once the workshop is completed, a 5-8 minute video promoting ELC will be made and the Congregational profile would be completed and sent to Pastor Wendel. A financial profile will also be put together with the help of the Council.

After all other steps have been completed, Emmanuel waits for a response and continues from there. The average call process after the Congregational profile is submitted is 8 ½ months. The congregation will be kept notified of the Call process along the way, but needs to remember that it is not a hasty process. After the meeting adjourned, the Call Committee gathered to choose a Chair and Secretary and discuss their next step. Each member received a copy of the Call Process Manual.
