What does the future hold for Emmanuel ?

The Call Committee met on September 1st to interview two candidates that had submitted themselves for consideration. One candidate removed their submission due to family considerations and the committee interviewed the other. After a positive interview, the Call Committee



decided to invite Pastor Ben Unseth for a weekend visit. He was able to meet with the Call Committee

and Council on September 11th and joined us all for worship on our Rally Sunday on September 12th.

After this visit, the Call Committee voted to recommend extending a call to Pastor Unseth, and at the Council meeting following, the Council also voted to accept this recommendation. The next step will be a Congregational vote on October 3rd. If the Congregation approves this recommendation, a formal offer will be extended to Pastor Unseth, and he will have the choice to accept the offer put forth by the Council or not. If all parties agree, then completion of the call will be submitted through the NALC and Pastor Unseth will be installed as our Pastor. If the process doesn't make it through to the completion of the call, we will go back to the first step of interviewing any interested pastors that submit their name to us. As always please be prayerful and patient in this process.

NO MISUNDERSTANDING

We know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him. Romans 8:28

Alexa, Siri, and other voice assistants embedded in smart devices in our homes occasionally misunderstand what we're saying. A six-year- old talked to her family's new device about cookies and a dollhouse. Later her mom received an email saying that an order of seven pounds of cookies and a \$170 dollhouse were on their way to her home. Even a talking parrot in London, whose owner had never bought anything online, somehow ordered a package of golden gift boxes without her knowledge. One person asked their device to "turn on the living room lights," and it replied, "There is no pudding room."

There's no such misunderstanding on God's part when we talk with Him. He's never confused, because He knows our hearts better than we do. The Spirit both searches our hearts and understands God's will. The apostle Paul told the churches in Rome that God promises He'll accomplish His good purpose of maturing us and making us more like His Son (Romans 8:28). 

UPDATE TO THE ANNUAL REPORT September 2021 Since the writing of the Annual Report, NALC Disaster Response has responded to the following disasters.

August 14, 2021: Gibson City Illinois flooded, over 200 homes were destroyed. NALC Disaster Response responded, using the disaster warehouse at American Lutheran Church, Rantoul, IL.

August 21, 2021: Waverly Tennessee flooded, killing 10 people with flash flooding. NALC Disaster Response responded and Reformation Lutheran Church Hendersonville is the point of contact. In the same severe thunderstorm, Maggie Valley North Carolina flooded and NALC Disaster Response responded through New Covenant Lutheran Church Morgantown and the disaster warehouse at Advent Lutheran King's Mountain NC.

August 29, 2021: Hurricane Ida struck the southern coast in Louisiana and continued northeast to the state of New York. NALC Disaster Response is responding to Covington, Lafayette, Baton Rouge, and Metairie Louisiana. Additionally, tornadoes were spawned when Ida hit eastern Pennsylvania and New Jersey and we are responding through our congregations in the Atlantic Mission Region, primarily Emmanuel Lutheran Elmer NJ, using the disaster warehouse at St. Matthew Lutheran Middle River Maryland.

Hundreds of Lousianans trapped by Hurricane Ida floodwaters were brought to safety on Monday as boats, helicopters, and high-water trucks worked as part of rescue efforts after the furious storm ravaged the coast and left more than one million homes without power.



As Hurricane Ida makes her way through the southern states, heading north, NALC Disaster Response has made the first deliveries of emergency relief supplies to Covington LA and Lafayette LA. The devastation that Ida has already wrought is unbelievable. Our hearts go out to all who have felt her impact and we know that recovery will take many years. Please keep the families and our volunteers in prayer. 7 deliveries have now been made to Covington, Lafayette, Baton Rouge, and Metairie LA from our NALC warehouses. Thousands of families are being served. The Good Shepherd Anglican Church is the distribution center and the volunteer housing for our NALC volunteers. Our 4-stall shower trailer has been delivered to the Good Shepherd.

Editor's note: it is good to read how our ability to help "stuff the truck" locally has the capability to help reach those who need such items through the work of our NALC Disaster Response Team.

A few changes have been made since our last update. We learned that we would not qualify for the Worth County Community Foundation Grant. And, after we experienced the nine + inches of rain and had flooding in the church basement, it made the ladies do some reconsidering on the replacement flooring options. So in order to keep things progressing, the women have chosen to take the flooring decision off the table for now and concentrate on moving forward with the cabinetry and plumbing needs. We have monies to use towards the labor for plumbing and electrical and will keep things progressing so that we should be able to get the cabinetry, a new island and countertop, sinks, exhaust fan, and a garbage disposal all finished. Arne has brought some of the base cabinets into the kitchen already and will continue to work on those, coordinating the countertop installation as well. The new appliances can be brought in after some of the plumbing and electrical is completed.

After that work is done, we can take a look at possibly applying for a grant to replace flooring and maybe purchase some new folding chairs for the Fellowship Hall. We thank all those that have contributed so far in this investment in our future.

In the spring, we can revisit the cost of flooring and possibly some new chairs for the Fellowship Hall and apply for a grant at that time. Arne will be coming sometime this week to bring lower cabinet doors and drawers. 4) Lutheran Retirement Home -September activities: Since there will not be outside visitors allowed to help with Bingo or the birthday party this month, we had asked for donations of Beanie babies to honor residents'

requests for them as prizes. We thank those who donated. <u>M/S/C to send \$30 to the LRH for</u> birthday party expenses and send 6 Beanie babies for Bingo prizes.

New Business: 1) Items from Fellowship Hall to be dispersed: The ladies have been weeding out items no longer needed and gathering them into one place and once all is sorted, the items will be available to anyone who wishes to take them. 2) New carafes: many of the old coffee carafes are wearing out, seals are breaking, etc. We will be looking into purchasing new ones in the near future.
