A Word from Interim Pastor David E Schafer ...

***Alleluia! Christ is Risen! He has Risen, Indeed!
Alleluia!***

Hasn't Easter already come and gone? The answer is "yes and no." Yes, we gathered on April 17th to hear the story once more that God raised his Son, Jesus Christ, up from death to life eternal. But Easter is always more than just one Sunday out of the year. Easter is a church season that lasts for 7 Sundays. This means, in part, the readings for the weeks of Easter all talk about the resurrection of Christ our Lord. The proclamation of the empty tomb has been the greatest story ever told. The Resurrection of Jesus Christ is the foundation of the Christian church.

I've always been comforted by St. Paul's writing in I Corinthians: "Now if Christ is proclaimed as raised from the dead, how can some of you say there is no resurrection of the dead? If there is no resurrection of the dead, then Christ has not been raised; and if Christ has not been raised, then our proclamation has been in vain and your faith has been in vain. We are even found to be representing God, because we testified of God that he raised Christ. If Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile and you are still in your sins. But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead." (I Cor. 15:12f)

These words have given me both comfort and hope when a loved one dies. I would like to commend these verses to you as well. The hardest funerals that I have conducted throughout my career were for people with little to no faith. People with little or no faith have little

to nothing in terms of a foundation to support them in the hardest moments of life. This is the reason that God has commanded us to remember the Sabbath day to keep holy. In the Small Catechism, Luther writes "We are to fear and love God so that we do not neglect his Word and the preaching of it, but regarded as holy and gladly hear and learn it."

Easter Sunday comes once a year. And this season of Easter spans seven weeks. Remember that the number seven represents completion and perfection. Moreover, each and every Sunday is to be a celebration of the resurrection of Christ our Lord.

It seems that the season of Lent, like Advent, always seems to catch me off-guard. In Advent, we prepare for the Christ Child to come and then celebrate His birth. We worship, spend time with loved ones, open gifts, and then, go back to our daily busyness of life in general. Somehow, then, it is always a surprise, when the Lenten season begins and, knowing that it is six weeks before Easter, it doesn't really make an impression yet. We begin the routine of preparing and attending weekly Lenten services and try to quiet our minds as we reflect and contemplate what is to come. How did it happen that the baby we celebrated not so long ago, has become a man with a "mission" that will be so different than many foresaw, but who's impact will last forever?

This year in particular, maybe the music, the reading of the lessons, or perhaps viewing "The Chosen", has offered a new perspective on who Christ was and is to us. Watching and listening, studying His word, opening our hearts to His call, recognizing the fulfillment of the prophets' words foretold. We understand how the Israelites and Jesus' followers may have felt- the conflict between the swift and just ruler they expected to come to rescue them and the passive and loving Son of Man who preached forgiveness and redemption. And yet, there are those who still wait in anticipation of the Messiah...

On Palm Sunday, I was joyful as I watched the children "follow the leader" and wave their palms. And as we participated in the reading of the Passion, I was moved by the words that I was required to speak as a member of the congregation. I was shocked to hear myself shout out to "Crucify Him", to be caught up and go along with the crowd, to hear Peter deny Christ three times, and to listen as Pilate said he would wash his hands as he could find no fault with Jesus. And ultimately, to envision him hanging on a cross for my sins, laid in a tomb, and wait...my heart was heavy!

Of course, we know once again, "the rest of the story"- that Jesus did not stay in the tomb, he rose again and conquered death so that we might live. What a story, what a victory, what a God we have who



loves us so much! Our hearts should be jubilant and our lives should reflect His mission. It is not the end, but only the beginning...

The following comes from Our Daily Bread, the January 15th devotion:

Life By Death

When I see the blood, I will pass over you.

Exodus 12:13

Carl was battling cancer and needed a double lung transplant. He asked God for new lung, but felt odd doing so. He confessed it's a strange thing to pray, because "someone has to die so that I might live."

Carl's dilemma highlights a basic truth of Scripture: God uses death to bring life. We see this in the story of the exodus. Born into slavery, the Israelites languished under the oppressive hands of the Egyptians. Pharaoh wouldn't release his grip until God made it personal. Every eldest son would die unless the family killed a spotless lamb and slathered its blood across their doorposts. (Exodus 12: 6-7, 12-13).

Today, you and I have been born into the bondage of sin. Satan wouldn't release his grip on us until God made it personal, sacrificing His perfect Son on the blood-splattered arms of the cross.

Jesus calls us to join Him there. Paul explained, "I have been crucified with Christ and I no longer live, but Christ lives in me" (Galatians 2:20). When we put our faith in God's spotless Lamb, we commit to daily dying with Him—dying to our sin so we might rise with Him to new life (Romans 6:4-5). We express this faith every time we say no to the shackles of sin and yes to the freedom of Christ. We're never more alive than when we die with Jesus.

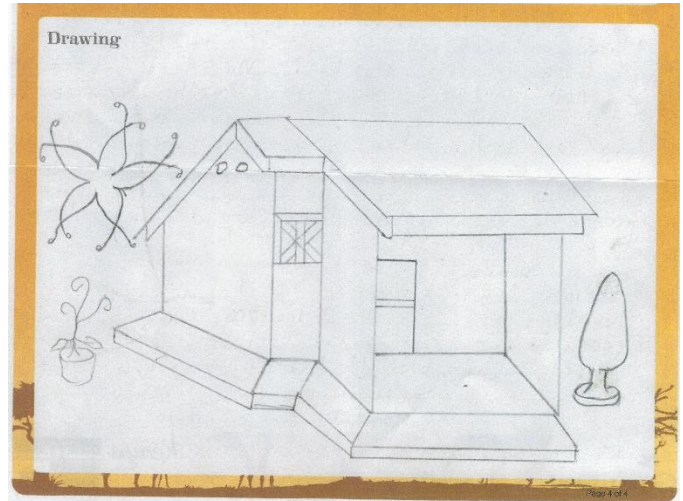
