Psalm 37:1-9

P: Do not fret because of the wicked; do not be envious of wrongdoers,

C: for they will soon fade like the grass, and wither like the green herb.

P: Trust in the Lord, and do good; so you will live in the land, and enjoy security.

C: Take delight in the Lord, and he will give you the desires of your heart.

P: Commit your way to the Lord; trust in him, and he will act.

C: He will make your vindication shine like the light, and the justice of your cause like the noonday.

P: Be still before the Lord, and wait patiently for him; do not fret over those who prosper in their way, over those who carry out evil devices.

C: Refrain from anger, and forsake wrath. Do not fret—it leads only to evil.

P: For the wicked shall be cut off, but those who wait for the Lord shall inherit the land.

Gospel: Luke 17:1-10

Jesus said to his disciples, ‘Occasions for stumbling are bound to come, but woe to anyone by whom they come! It would be better for you if a millstone were hung around your neck and you were thrown into the sea than for you to cause one of these little ones to stumble. Be on your guard! If another disciple sins, you must rebuke the offender, and if there is repentance, you must forgive. And if the same person sins against you seven times a day, and turns back to you seven times and says, “I repent”, you must forgive.’

The apostles said to the Lord, ‘Increase our faith!’ The Lord replied, ‘If you had faith the size of a mustard seed, you could say to this mulberry tree, “Be uprooted and planted in the sea”, and it would obey you.

‘Who among you would say to your slave who has just come in from ploughing or tending sheep in the field, “Come here at once and take your place at the table”? Would you not rather say to him, “Prepare supper for me, put on your apron and serve me while I eat and drink; later you may eat and drink”? Do you thank the slave for doing what was commanded? So you also, when you have done all that you were ordered to do, say, “We are worthless slaves; we have done only what we ought to have done!” ’
