A Word from our Interim Pastor...

Dear Friends in Christ,

Sunday, March 12th, I shared the devotional from the back of a bulletin from the early 1950's. It had been saved in my father's Bible that he was given when he entered Luther Seminary in St. Paul, following the end of WWII. He was starting a Mission Congregation on the outskirts of Chicago. He, like many friends he had at St. Olaf College, went off to war. Not all returned. My Father, as a B-29 tail gunner, survived a crash. He and one other lived, while the rest of the crew did not.

Many of his buddies who made it home, went off to Luther Seminary in St. Paul. I can't help but think WWII led them there. WWI and WWII had phrases like, "battle fatigue", "shell shock", "the 1000-mile stare..." More recently, PTSD (Post Traumatic Stress Disorder) is the term used.

I believe Dad saved, "Pick Me Up, O Lord", because it described post war life for him that at times were tough, but God continually helped him work through things not so good, to things that were and are very good. "The victory which was thine, Thou has given to those who trust thee."

As Lent again leads us to Easter, I believe that "Pick Me Up, O Lord," speaks of all at times and to us as well. - *Pastor Paul Weeg*

Pick Me Up, O Lord!

Life is too much for me. I lie down at night haunted by the failures of the day, fearful of the hours of darkness, dreading the unknown tomorrow. I awaken to see the sunlight of a new day, but the shadows of threatening perils already cast their long arms across my path.

Every newspaper and every newscast remind me that vast, dark powers are at work, to destroy my world. And I have no defense against them. There are moments when everything and everyone appear to be against me.

The aches and pains in my body all alert me to the disease and death that at any moment may strike me down.

And deep within somewhere, the accusing finger of conscience keeps tormenting me with the sins that wear me down and make me too weary even to protest.

If even Thou, O Lord, shouldst mark iniquities and judge me, I could not stand to live. But there is mercy with Thee!

I dare to cry to Thee because I have seen Thee on a cross. I need not probe furtively in the world about me nor in my own heart for evidences of Thy love and power. I have seen Thee bear a cross, and on that cross overcome the evil one. The victory which was Thine, Thou has given to those who trust Thee. I cast myself upon Thee, and pray that Thou wouldst lift me up above the swirling waters.

I have no self-confidence. Were I to stand alone, unsupported by Thee, even the feeblest enemy could dislodge me. I am often upset by trifles. Nestled in Thy mighty and merciful arms, however, not even the prince of darkness can reach me. My confidence is in Thee alone.

Even the last enemy, death, can do me no lasting harm. When death has done its work, Thou dost raise me up again to live forever with Thee in the everlasting kingdom. O Lord, pick me up –and hold me—now and forevermore.

Please join us in recognizing these students and the completion of their studies.





News from Lutheran World Relief

The following information has been gleaned from information from the "God's Love in Action" magazine sent out by LWR. Since we support LWR in various ways, this information should be interesting in how we are able to help our brothers and sisters in Christ internationally through our gifts:

Personal Care Kits: Personal Care Kits help our neighbors in crisis. They are specifically designed to help people coping with poverty, disaster, conflict and more. In the direst of situations, these extensions of your congregation's love bring dignity, and hope. They are one of the most requested items.

What is in a personal care kit? Bath towel, bath soap, nail clippers, comb, and a toothbrush

Moses Kaboga, LWR staff in Tanzania, speaks of the impact these kits make on pregnant and new mothers: "Most pregnant and new mothers, especially in the rural areas, do not have access to personal care items. The items help them clean and cover themselves and their babies, protecting them from the cold. In addition to keeping themselves and their babies clean, they also love the soaps because they smell so good!

It is a huge challenge to get pregnant mothers to give birth at health facilities. It is often far from home, and they worry about the expenses of medical care. We found that distributing the Personal Care Kits is a great incentive for women to come to the health facilities. This way we can make sure the mothers and newborns receive the proper care plus they have supplies to help them when they get back home."

many that are saved back for local use. Quilt Sunday was held on March 19th and is always a fun time to display all the various colors and styles of quilts that many hands have labored over. We have a blessing litany that acknowledges both the maker and the recipient of the quilts, blankets , and kits that are sent each year.

National Quilting Day was on March 18th, 2023. "...we at Lutheran World Relief have a LOT to celebrate! For more than 75 years, nearly 28 million quilts have been made for people in need around the world! These gifts of love make life brighter, softer, and a bit more comfortable for our neighbors around the world struggling with chronic poverty, illness, natural disaster and conflict. THANK YOU.
