## Reflections

In this season of Lent, beginning with Ash Wednesday and continuing until Easter Sunday, we reflect on our lives. We receive the sign of the cross in ashes on our foreheads, to remember that "from ash we come and to ash we shall return." The season is such a change from the Christmas season we came from, when we know the reason we celebrate and prepare for, but this season is somber and quiet, a time to reflect: on our failings, or at least the realization that we cannot do things on our own. We cannot be who God wants us to be. without his help, his guidance, and his forgiveness. We remember that Jesus was tempted by Satan in the wilderness. We struggle with our imperfections. We cry out in frustration, asking for deliverance...

And yet, we do know that he hears our cries and knows our failings. He listens to our heartaches and rejoices in our accomplishments.

There is a "light at the end of the tunnel." We know that when we



stumble, he will lift us, when we are weak, He is strong. If we confess our sins, He will forgive us. What hope and strength we can receive from that. The promise of victory over death. As we move through this season, let us continue to reflect on ourselves and what Christ endured on our behalf.

... how Compassion International, the organization that we support Lawrence through, was started? The following devotion was received on my Daily Inspiration phone app on February 23rd and I felt it was very fitting and wanted to share it with you...

## **Mission of Compassion**

## Psalm 34:18 The Lord is near to those who have a broken heart, and saves those who have a crushed spirit.

Reverend Everett Swanson discovered an unexpected mission in South Korea. Swanson, an evangelist, had prepared to minister to American troops battling in the Korean War. One morning, he watched city workers clearing what he thought were piles of rags from the streets. On closer look, he saw that it was not trash they were moving, but children who had frozen in the night.

The plight of war orphans sent him home a troubled man. Swanson's broken heart for the abandoned children of South Korea led him to start raising money to cloth these orphans through the winter. From there, Compassion International was born. Today, this nonprofit Christ-centered organization gathers funds from all over the world and distributes them to needy children in the form of food, clothes, housing, medical care, and education, all in Jesus' name.

To date, Swanson's broken heart has revived the crushed spirits of people in 97 countries and counting. God heard the cries of the innocent. Yes, His mighty hand can miraculously save them, but He often uses the hands and broken hearts of His people. If your heart breaks for the neglected and the abandoned, you are not alone. Jesus' heart breaks for them, too. Let God direct you as you work for Him to give hope to the lost.

Reflection: What needs stir my heart? I will ask God how I can help minister to those needs- and I will listen for God's response.

...that Emmanuel sent \$1860 to Food for the Poor as a designated organization chosen by the Stewardship board in 2022? I was contacted by a representative of the organization about a program they were looking to have churches support and agreed to let them apply our funds towards that particular program. The following is information about how our funds, along with other churches' funds, are being used:



We at Food For The Poor (FFTP) thank you for working toward fulfilling Christ's mission to serve the needs of the poorest of the poor in the Caribbean and Latin America. No matter what the challenge is, God wants His children to triumph, and your support shows His beloved children that He is with us all. FFTP's "Pastry Courses for Vulnerable Women" project is one in which His daughters will triumph!

Like other educational setups in the Dominican Republic, FFTP's in-country partner Cáritas Arquidiocesana de Santiago is always looking for ways in which to educate the vulnerable population that has not had the opportunity to study and advance in life. Through this program, 100 underserved women ages 18 to 60 will be taught pastry baking, which will allow them to find jobs in the industry and even open their own businesses. They trust in God and have decided to follow these words of wisdom:

## "Apply your heart to instruction and your ears to words of knowledge." Proverbs 23:12

We hope this project brings joy to the church. Please feel free to involve anyone you have in your heart and thank you for being part of this Godly outreach to assist those in need. May God's bountiful blessings continue to shine upon you. We look forward to working with you through this project.

**Project Goal:** Train 100 women from the Francisco del Rosario Sánchez community in the Dominican Republic in pastry baking and related activities, providing them with the skills necessary to produce a decent income.

**Project Description:** Through the Pastry Courses for Vulnerable Women project, Food For The Poor (FFTP) aims to train 100 low-income women (ages 18 to 60 years old) in the art of pastry making.

The courses will start them off in their own business or teach them the necessary skills to be hired by bakeries needing qualified personnel. In either case, these women will be able to work in the industry and earn a decent income to support their families.

The following components will comprise the bakery project:

**Bakery courses** 

Educational materials for the bakery Baking supplies, tools and equipment Training and administrative personnel Mobile phone service

Transportation

Our in-country partner (ICP) for this program will be Cáritas Arquidiocesana de Santiago.

#### Total Project Costs: \$26,156.84

Completed project budgets are subject to change if not fully funded within six months. The completion date of this project may be extended for issues related to weather, natural disaster or civil unrest to the extent that such events exceed normal conditions and impede the project's progress.

Since 2000, FFTP has been working in the Dominican Republic to serve the 23.4% of its residents living below the poverty line. Francisco del Rosario Sánchez is located northwest of the province of Santiago. In Francisco del Rosario Sánchez, there is a high number of women who do not work. Many are single mothers, and if they have husbands, the spouses do not produce enough to support the family. These women have expressed their wishes to be trained in pastrymaking to start their own businesses, independently or in partnership with others. Many would like to be employed by bakeries needing qualified personnel.

We invite you to walk with us through this journey and experience the satisfaction of imparting knowledge and skills to women in need. You will be helping them earn a decent living and support their households, something they hadn't been able to do before.
