A New Year...

What do these words mean to you? When you think about a new year, are you filled with dread or anticipation? Do you, like many, wish to be done with the previous year and ready to move on to what may seem like a better one? Or do you like to look back on the past, reflecting on what the year was like, good and bad? There is no right or wrong answer. Your answer might depend on a variety of things- whether you are an optimist or a pessimist, whether you had a "good" or "bad" year, or maybe just your mood at the moment. No matter how we feel about beginning a new year, there is one thing that none of us can change and that is the fact that it is going to happen. And since this newsletter has come out a little later than I had anticipated, we are already heading into 2024.

That leads me to ask the next question: have you made any New Year's resolutions? Is there anything you might like to do differently this year? The following devotion caught my eye back in October and I earmarked it to use at just this time:

Our Daily Bread October 19th:

Seek first his kingdom and his righteousness and all these things will be given to you as well. Matthew 6:33

The morning commenced like a track meet. I practically jumped out of bed, launching into the teeth of the day's deadlines. Get the kids to school. *Check*. Get to work. *Check*. I blasted full throttle into writing my "To Do" list, in which personal and professional tasks tumbled together in an avalanche-like litany:

"....13. Edit article. 14. Clean office. 15. Strategic team planning. 16. Write tech blog. 17. Clean basement. 18. Pray."

By the time I got to number eighteen, I'd remembered that I needed God's help. But I'd gotten that far before it even occurred to me that I was going at it alone, trying to manufacture my own momentum.

Jesus knew. He knew our days would crash one into another, a sea of ceaseless urgency. So He instructs, "Seek first [God's] kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well" (Matthew 6:33).

It's natural to hear Jesus' words as a *command*. And they are. But there's more here *-an invitation*. In Matthew 6, Jesus invites us to exchange the world's frantic anxiety (*vv.25-32*) for a life of trust, day by day. God, by His grace, helps us all of our days- even when we get to number eighteen on our list before we remember to see life from His perspective.

How can we turn to God first each day? On stressful days, what helps you trust Jesus with things demanding your immediate attention?

Father, thank You for your invitation to relinquish my anxiety and to embrace the life of abundant provision You offer me each day.

Does the scenario seem familiar? I know it does for me. It's easy to get caught up in the day, racing to check off the "to-do" list and then realize, we've forgotten to put Jesus first. I'll make this our first challenge for the new year: *Put Jesus First!*

The second challenge is to realize that no matter what the last year was like, this is a new one, a time to start over, a fresh slate to fill. Of course, we can't forget what has happened in the past, but we can and need to move forward. The following devotion also speaks to this:

Our Daily Bread November 14th:

I will forgive their wickedness and will remember their sins no more. Jeremiah 31:34

I never saw the ice. But I felt it. The back end of the pickup I was driving- my grandfather's-fishtailed. One swerve, two, three-and I was airborne, flying off a fifteen-foot embankment. I remember thinking, *This would be awesome if I wasn't going to die.* A moment later, the truck crunched into the steep slope and rolled to the bottom. I crawled out of the crushed cab, unscathed.

The truck was utterly totaled that December morning in 1992. God had spared me. But what about my grandfather? What would *he* say? In fact, he never said a single word about the truck. Not one. There was no scolding, no repayment plan, nothing. Just forgiveness. And a grandfather's smile that I was okay.

My grandfather's grace reminds me of God's grace in Jeremiah 31. There, despite their tremendous failings, God promises a restored relationship with His people, saying, "I will forgive their wickedness and will remember their sins no more" (v.34).

I'm sure my grandfather never forgot that I'd wrecked his truck. But he acted just like God does here, not remembering it, not shaming me, not making me work to repay the debt I rightfully owed. Just as God says He'll do, my grandfather chose to remember it no more, as if the destructive thing I'd done had never happened.

How should God's forgiveness affect how you see your failures? How can you show other's grace?

Father, thank You for Your forgivenss. When I cling to my shame, help me to recall that, in Christ, You remember my sins no more.

(Editor's note: I realized that both devotions were by the same author, as I was writing them today! Maybe it is one of those "God-winks"?)

May this year be a "New Year" of possibilities, one that can open up new or better things ahead. Remember that, "God forgives you and remembers no more". You have a clean slate, a new year, a new beginning. And He is always with you! Embrace this New Year and what it has in store for you!!



Stewardship Musings

The following is taken from a devotional, <u>Mornings with</u> <u>Jesus</u> and appropriate to think on as we enter a new year:

Give, and it will be given to you. A good measure, pressed down, shaken together and running over, will be poured into your lap. For with the measure you use, it will be measured to you. Luke 6:38 (NIV)

As a youngster, I watched the offering basket get passed around at church each Sunday. Almost everyone gave, and we dutifully put our family's envelope in too, with my mom's perfect penmanship indicating name, address, and amount. I grew up understanding I was supposed to give in the offering plate, but as a young adult in the work world, I got stingy. I had learned about biblical tithing, giving one-tenth of my income to the local church, but it took me a while to get on board. I loved to travel and eat out and accumulated a good amount of credit card debt to prove it. I ran out of money by the end of the month. How could I give away 10 percent?

My transformation around tithing was gradual but effective. As I grew in my relationship with Jesus, I was struck by the depth of His sacrifice for me on the cross. I realized that I prospered



personally because I acknowledged that Jesus ordered my steps and orchestrated my success-not me. Once I understood this, I knew I could not withhold support for the church- a place where I watched people answer altar calls and give their lives to Him.

Through tithing and giving with a grateful heart, I play a part in advancing Jesus's kingdom on earth. There's no better investment!

Lisa Bartz will teach confirmation class. 2) Elaine Huebner visitation tonight, funeral tomorrow. 3) Thanksgiving service will be incorporated into the Sunday service on the 26th, along with a baptism that day. 4) Christmas Day falls on a Monday this year. Since there are going to be two services already on the 24th, there will not be Christmas Day service this year. 5) There is a wedding on the schedule for September 2024 and an inquiry about lining up a pastor. Council would like to check with Pastor Weeg first if he would like to do the wedding and then proceed from there.
